In the past we had unlimited number of troops and companies participating in the Boscorees from all our Salesian Family institutions across India. Unlike the past Boscorees, this time for the 14th National Boscoree the number of participants is limited due to COVID-19 restrictions and other factors. Thus following the directive given by the SPCSA here is the summary of the approved number of participants for the 14th National Boscoree 2022-23.

CAMPSITE:

The participants of the 14th National BOSCOREE will be divided into 16 Sub-Camps in 3 Categories:

- Sub-Camps for institutions with MIXED TROOPS
- Sub-Camps for institutions with SCOUTS ONLY
- Sub-Camps for institutions with GUIDES ONLY

All our campers are hereby informed to bring adequate warm clothes. The temperature at the venue during winter is around 7° C - 10° C.

The Organizers have decided to follow the COVID-19 protocols during the event to ensure safety and good health of all the participants. ***It is mandatory for all participants to produce their COVID-19 Vaccination Certificates at the registration counter on arrival.***

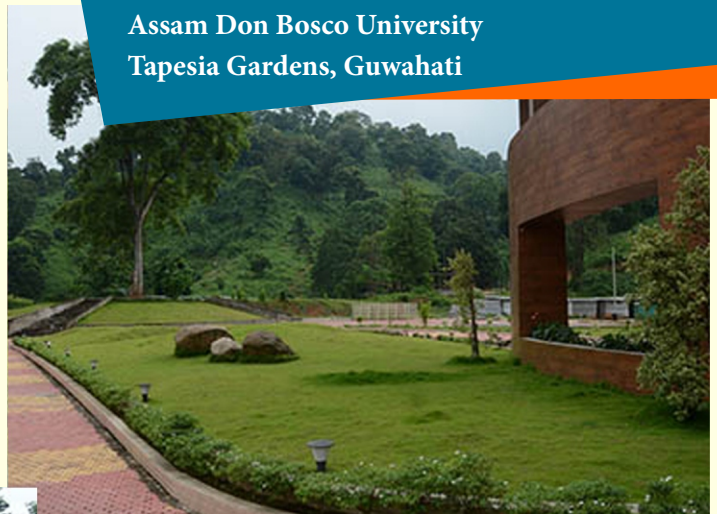
The BOSCOREE competitions will be awarded in the following manner:

- o Competitions will be organized in SUB CAMPS only.
- o All the competitions will be based on the theme “SAVE OUR PLANET HOME”.
- o The criteria for every competition are stated clearly. You are kindly requested to adhere to all the rules stipulated in this letter. Please do not exceed the time limit set for each competition. The winners will be awarded based on the decision of the judges. The decision of judges shall be final.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ACTIVITIES AND COMPETITIONS

1. MARCH PAST

- It will be done Province wise.
- Each Province should decide who will represent the Province.
- It could be a single institution or members from different institutions within the Province.
- The Province March Past will have 30 members = 1 Province Flag bearer + 1 Placard holder + 1 Leader + 3 columns x 9 rows.
- It would be preferable if the Province March Past team have both scouts and guides.
- The Province Placard will be prepared by the Boscoree Organizing Committee and will be provided before the Inaugural Ceremony.
- Colour Party dress allowed for 5 persons.

2. PIONEERING PROJECTS (Duration 3 hours)

- This event is an occasion to promote team spirit and harmony among fellow scouts/guides through construction of pioneering projects.
- Each Sub Camp will erect 3 pioneering projects (tower/bridge).
- Each troop/company will send 4 representatives for this event.
- All material for the Pioneering projects will be provided by the Organizers. No material is to be cut or destroyed.
- The same participants will dismantle the project on the last day.
- The pioneering project will appear in our next issue of the BOSCOREE DIGI NEWS for you to practice.

3. KIT INSPECTION:

- Every participant is expected to be in COMPLETE UNIFORM as stipulated.
- Gadgets: All material for gadgets is to be brought by the troops/companies. New gadgets are to be made everyday.
- All commands to be given either in English only or Hindi only. Do not mix languages while giving command/order.
- Inspection will take place everyday after the breakfast.

3. PAINTING (Duration 1 hour)

- All materials for painting must be brought by the participants. You could use any medium for painting eg: acrylic, water colours, pastels, colour pencils etc.

- The dimensions will be 14 inches x 21 inches. One chart will be provided by the Organizers. The chart must depict the theme, SAVE OUR PLANET HOME through the art work.
- Maximum number of participants: 5 per institution.

4. SKILL-O-RAMA - Handicraft (Duration 2 hours)

- All materials for the Skill-O-Rama must be brought by the participants.
- Maximum number of participants: 4 per troop/company.
- All skill work must be done on the spot. No one is allowed to display prepared artefacts.
- Use of biodegradable materials ONLY will be permit.

5. EXHIBITIONS (Duration 2 hours)

- Non-biodegradable materials should be avoided.
- Depict the cultural/lifestyle through LIVE PRESENTATIONS. Maximum 10 participants.
- Use of traditional costumes, jewellery, tools/musical instruments is recommended.
- Art and craft materials must be made by the participants and not brought from the market.
- Please remove your exhibits from the allotted places provided immediately after the competition. The Boscoree Organizers will not be held responsible for any exhibits that go missing.

- Participants for the Colour Party must come in proper dress code only.
- Bring your own National flag and Scout flag.

- Those using pre-recorded music must bring it in a pendrive.

10. ADVENTURE AWARDS (Duration 4-5 hours)

- A set of 20 adventure games will be setup in the campsite.
- Participants are expected to complete a minimum of 15 adventure games to be awarded with the Adventure Badge.
- For all Adventure Games successfully done, participants must get signatures of the respective instructors on the Adventure Game Card. At the end of the Adventure games the Scout Master / Guide Captain will collect the Adventure Game Card of the entire troop/company and hand it over to their respective Sub-Camp Chief.
- The Adventure badge will be worn on the left-hand sleeve.
- All the Adventure Games will be done under strict supervision and will be done only during the specified time. Use of the Adventure games will not be permitted at other times.

11. CULTURAL DANCE PRESENTATION (Duration 5 minutes)

- All can participate.
- Language: Any language.
- Pre-recorded music NOT allowed. Participants need to dance, sing and play traditional instruments. Avoid any form of modern dance.
- Use of traditional costumes is important.

12. PAGEANT-O-RAMA (Duration 6 minutes) & BOSCOREE MARCH

- Pageant-O-Rama will be held school-wise. The participants should adorn themselves with traditional costumes for the pageant.
- Use Province Flags / School Flags.
- Use prepared banners / placards on BOSCOREE Theme & Save environment slogan/messages.
- Avoid the use of non-environment friendly materials for banners.
- Scout Masters / Guide Captains are fully responsible for discipline all along the Boscoree March route.
- Participants will march through the charted route only, from the venue of flag off and return to the same venue.
- Use of traditional costumes / musical instruments / traditional dances is allowed along the route. Participants are requested to adhere to the traffic rules and respect fellow travelers along the route.
- Use of appropriate yells / slogans is allowed. Scout Masters / Guide Captains are responsible to ensure that the participants do not hurt religious / social sentiments of people around. Participants are expected to march along in their own troops.

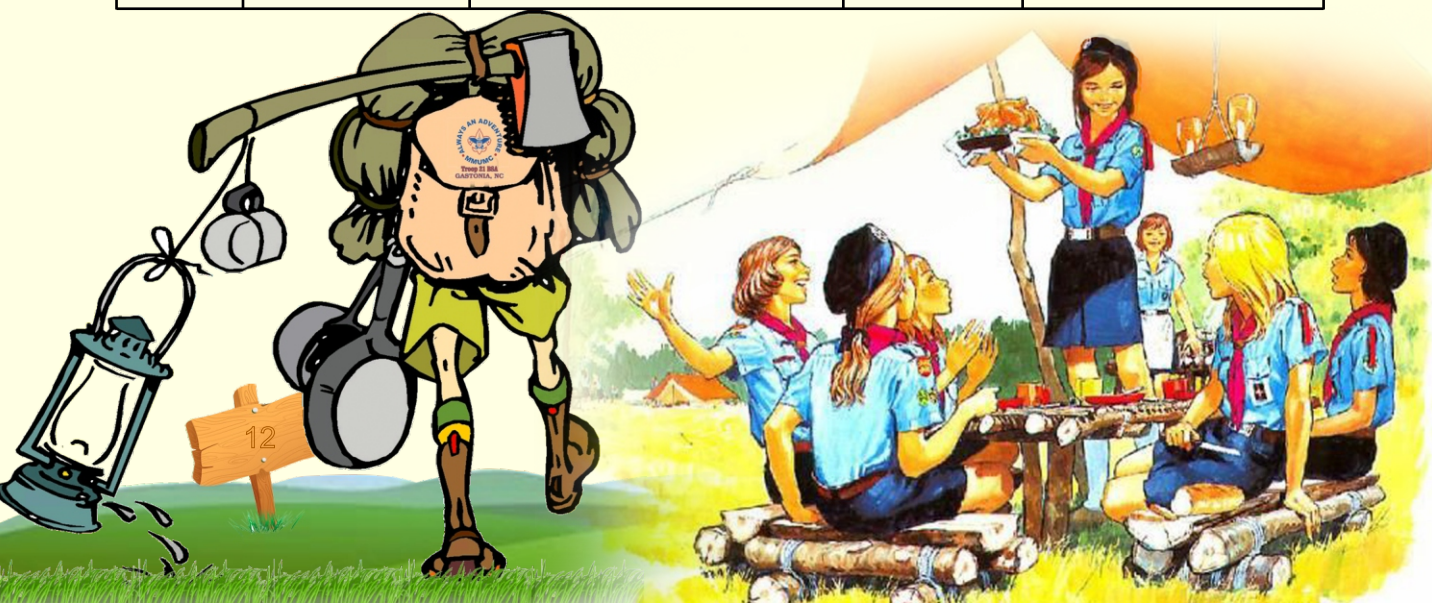
13. GRAND CAMP FIRE

- These presentations are non-competitive. It is a celebration of our National Unity and Salesian spirit through Scouting.



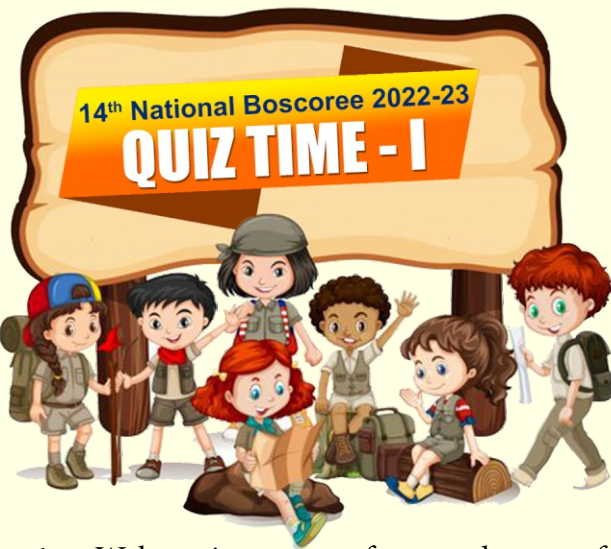

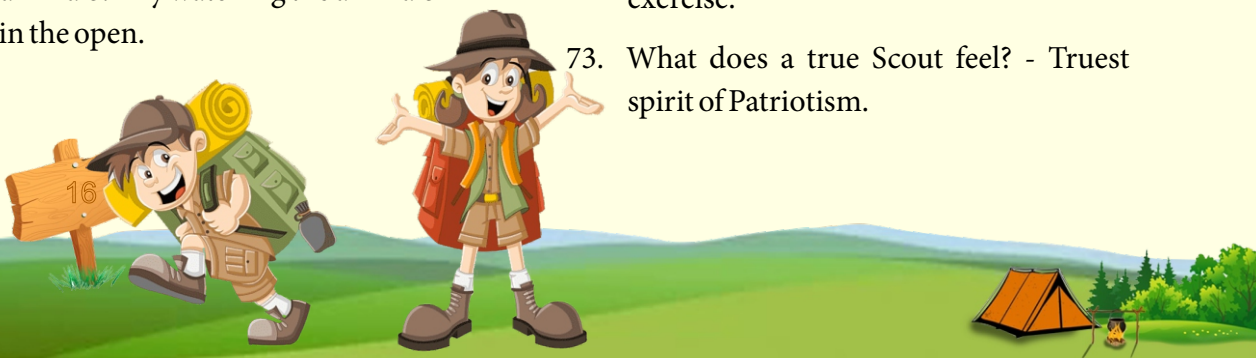
1. Who is the founder of Scouting/Guiding? - Lord Baden Powell of Gilwell.
2. Where was Baden-Powell born? When? - In Gilwell, on Feb 22, 1857.
3. What is the full name of B.P.? - Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell.
4. Who was B.P.'s mother? - Daughter of the British Admiral W.T. Sonyth.
5. Who was Joseph Brewer Smith? - B.P.'s great grandfather.
6. When did B.P.'s father die? - When Robert was around three years old.
7. Where did B.P. study? - Charterhouse School in London.
8. What was B.P.'s hobby in his childhood? - Hiking, camping, sailing, and tracing the source of the river Thames.
9. When did B.P. begin his adventurous career? - In 1876, when he came over to India as a sub-lieutenant at the age of 19.
10. Into what part of the army was he incorporated? - Into the cavalry that took part in the Cremean War.
11. When did B.P. become a captain? - B.P. became a captain in the British army at the age of 26.
12. What was the nickname given to B.P. by the Africans? - IMPESSA.
13. What does IMPESSA mean? - "Wolf that never sleeps".
14. When did B.P. become a Colonel? - In 1899, before he left for Mafeking.
15. Where is Mafeking situated? - In South Africa.
